1. I was highly impressed with the introductory recorded speech that you delivered highlighting the achievement of our children at large. As parents, this is the one time that we get to hear and physically feel how much potential our children have and how well they perform in the public and private sectors.
2. The quality of themes so far over the past 2 years has been nothing short of excellent!
3. I had the chance to come back stage and be with the children for sometime on Saturday and each year that passes by, it is clear that these children do love their teachers and peers. They are groomed as a family and it makes me proud to have been part of this family since the inception of our school.
4. The children all performed extremely well. They took their roles sincerely and all children seemed to be happy with what they did - big or small roles - NO DIFFERENCE!!!

I do have a few suggestions that I would like to bring up for future annual days/large school functions:

2. 3. I think that you should have a parents committee (completely voluntary of course) in place, to help out with small issues - for instance forgotten lunches, emergency runs for supplies and small things.
4. If the function continues to be at Kikani, perhaps we could set up a canopy for shade as the time of the year that annual day happens is usually the beginning of summer.
5. Water stations should also be provided in plentiful (many kids didn't know where to get extra water!)
6. With enough practice, I think that we should be able to allow the children to use their voices (rather than pre-recorded voices) on stage, LIVE! It makes all the more difference - if they forget a few lines, that's part of it - as parents we don't expect perfection - just the best that these kids can do (mistakes and all)!
